Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

The "EPIC Cultural Fusion Festival," held in Bansko and Strumyani, Bulgaria, on May 28–30, 2025, was an international town-twinning event organized under the European program "Embracing Our Shared Past" (EPIC). Hosted by the Municipality of Strumyani in partnership with AIM and supported by municipalities from Italy, Greece, Slovenia, and Spain, the event aimed to deepen European solidarity by using culture and heritage as bridges for understanding, cooperation, and shared identity.

The three-day workshop brought together local authorities, NGOs, cultural practitioners, and policy experts to explore how local traditions and heritage practices can strengthen European values. The consortium included second-level local government bodies such as the Municipality of Strumyani (Bulgaria), Comune Di Soriano Nel Cimino (Italy), the Municipality of Veroia (Greece), the Municipality of Novo Mesto (Slovenia), and the Ajuntament de Sueca (Spain), as well as civil society actors such as AIM (Bulgaria), EQUALINE (Greece), and ZAVOD BOTER (Slovenia).

Day 1 was primarily dedicated to participant arrival, welcoming, and networking. Guests were received in Bansko with informal introductions and coffee, followed by an opening speech that set the tone for cross-cultural collaboration. A relaxed welcome dinner in the evening offered participants an early chance to connect in a friendly, intercultural setting.

Day 2 opened formally with a presentation of the agenda and project vision, followed by short speeches on culture and heritage preservation in Europe. Representatives from the participating municipalities presented their perspectives on European integration and community cohesion. The afternoon featured expert speeches on the role of cultural identity, EU heritage policy, and cultural diplomacy. Participants engaged in a moderated discussion on building unity through shared values, followed by a hands-on cultural workshop where municipalities presented traditional dishes and shared the stories behind them. The day concluded with a shared dinner to further enhance community bonds.

Day 3, the final day, focused on thematic exploration and training. Morning sessions included "Folk Traditions as Living Heritage," "Why Culture Matters to Our Future," and "Cultural Leadership for a Shared Future." These were followed by two-part workshops on using culture to overcome division and linking local traditions to European policy. The interactive format encouraged collaboration and practical idea development. A Q&A session allowed reflection on grassroots cultural innovation. In the evening, participants enjoyed a cultural night with storytelling and performances representing their regions.

The final activities of the event took place in Strumyani, beginning with a study visit to the municipality's decision-making departments, offering a close look at governance and cultural programming. An open forum featured artistic performances themed "Voices and Movements of Unity," and the concluding lab session allowed stakeholders, including mayors, citizens, and NGO leaders, to co-create a symbolic "Cultural Declaration of Unity." After a closing ceremony and lunch, participants departed with a renewed sense of European belonging and cultural purpose.

Dissemination efforts were integrated throughout the event. Activities were documented via video and photography, while social media channels provided real-time updates to audiences across Europe. Local and regional media highlighted the event's significance, and informational materials, such as newsletters, posters, and event kits, were distributed among participants and their home communities. The outputs of the event, including the Cultural Declaration of Unity, will continue to be shared postevent to maximize reach and sustainability.

To conclude, the EPIC event demonstrated the power of youth-led and community-driven initiatives in shaping a united and inclusive Europe. Through thoughtful discussions, creative workshops, and cultural exchange, participants deepened their engagement with European identity, sustainability, and solidarity. The Municipality of Strumyani, in cooperation with AIM and its European partners, provided an empowering space for dialogue and joint action. As participants return home, they carry with them the tools and momentum to initiate further cooperation and bring the EPIC spirit to life across Europe.
